The BMus (Hons) Commercial Music Technology focuses on the creation, development and delivery of commercial audio. Areas of study include advanced recording in both analogue and digital landscapes, mixing, mastering techniques and spatial audio experiences for emerging technologies. The programme modules are designed to integrate skills, knowledge and understanding of commercial music industries and their future development.

You will gain an in depth understanding of music and audio creation as well as its consumption by society. From audio conception, creation, capture to its manipulation and final delivery to the consumer, you'll learn and explore audio synthesis, digital and analogue recording practices, advanced microphone and mixing techniques, audio mastering and composition for media platforms. Students will gain valuable insights from industry professionals on how to thrive in today's industry landscapes. The course encourages collaboration with other pathways, giving each student the opportunity to work alongside peers from other specialist areas of study.

This is an advanced course for aspiring or established music producers and audio engineers who are looking to develop advanced skills and conduct in-depth research in contemporary practices.
